This past weekend was the feast day for St. Pope John Paul II. If you are around my age, then this is the pope we grew up with. He served as pope for 27 years, beginning in 1978. In the late 1980s he had a special mission to spread peace throughout the world, instituting a Day of Prayer for World Peace in 1986 and then the annual World Youth Day three years later. He called himself "a witness to hope" and spread the Good News of Christ through his words, spoken and written, and actions.

It is important to recognize those around us that exemplify God's love. As a child I didn't think about it much, but I knew there was something special about St. Pope John Paul II while he served the Church. I felt similarly about St. Teresa of Calcutta. These saints lived while I lived, and showed us all how God can still deeply touch the lives of those living today.

Our accrediting body, WCEA, has created the different surveys based on the National Standards and Benchmarks for Effective Catholic Schools (NSBECS). There are five sections to the parent survey, one section to tell us who you are, and then four asking 42 specific questions in reference to the standards. The final question allows for a free response.
