


Week 4 Newsletter September 21, 2022



Greetings Holy Family,

At the start of the year educators all over are welcoming students back to the school and into classrooms, and before the rigors of learning set in they take time to build relationships within the space. Having strong relationships between teacher and student, and student to student, builds trust within the classroom. Before the school year began I shared with our teachers my priority of celebrating each child for who they are and what they bring to the classroom. I did this with the phrase, "we all matter, so let's make that matter." The beginning of the year is also a teachers' time to set routines and structures that will set the foundation of how all things work over the course of the year. Each of our teachers made these things matter at the start of the school year.

Well here we are, in week four, and I can see the fruits of our labor within our community - strong connections between students and adults and peers, and students who know and meet classroom and school expectations. There has also been a shift to focus on the rigor and joys of learning. My walks and classroom visits at the start of week four allow me to overhear conversations on math, to see students working independently and collaboratively on activities, and I see teachers leading lessons on material that will push students to grow. Don't misunderstand me, many of our classes have been at this level for a week or more, but now it is noticeable from the youngest to the oldest classes.

Some highlights of learning I've witnessed are in the pictures above, but also include:

- \* 4<sup>th</sup> graders writing I hope they are bringing home drafts of pieces to share, they are truly creative writers
- st Kindergarten religion lessons studying God's creation and the animals on the earth
- \* 6th ELA reading novels and completing reading response assignments, thinking critically about what they read
- \* 2<sup>nd</sup>, 3<sup>rd</sup>, 4<sup>th</sup>, art from foxes, to barns, trees, and waterfalls we have inspiring artists (and artistic teachers) among us
- \* 1<sup>st</sup> grade reading students have taken time to select books for book boxes and joyfully read independently and with their teacher during readers workshop time
- \* 8<sup>th</sup> Science & Math every class I see blows me away, the way they can see and think with a science/mathematical mind to solve intricate problems
- \* 5<sup>th</sup> grade collaboration whether it is ELA or another content area, these students accept the challenges presented to them and work with each other to accomplish tasks
- \* 7<sup>th</sup> Social Studies group conversations and sharing knowledge through engaging activities

I am seeing learning happen every day, and our students are fully engaged. We are just at the start of this year's learning journey, and already I feel we have a lot to be proud of. I pray that you are celebrating your scholars at home at night, as you help them with homework, as your review completed work, and as you help them prepare for school each day. They are in it and making excellence happen.

## Empowering God's Children Youth Safe Environment Program

Twice yearly we participate in the Archdiocesan *Empowering God's Children* Youth Safe Environment Program teaching our children about personal safety and advocacy. We engage in these lessons at school to help support your teaching of safe touching and self advocacy at home These lessons are typically taught in the months of October and April by our classroom teachers, one lesson each month. Since you are the primary educator of your child(ren) it is at your discretion whether you'd like your child to participate in these classroom lessons. ## **Pre-K Playground**

Items have been delivered, and we are excited to take the next step to install a new play apparatus and increase the space to the play chip area. Our current plan to bring the dream into reality is two fold. Part one is

to install the apparatus and bark perimeter pieces and part two is spreading play chips in the PK and general playground area.
