Tips for Parent-Teacher Conferences

Authentic family engagement is critical to student success. Families are children's first and most important teachers. Together, parents and classroom teachers are partners in ensuring student's academic and social-emotional strengths and needs are supported.

Parent-teacher conferences offer an opportunity for you and your child's teacher to communicate about academic progress, build a supportive partnership and for you to provide the teacher with important information about your child. Here are a few tips to help families prepare for the face-to-face meeting and conversation.

Prepare

Spend a few minutes talking with your child before the conference to get ready. Some students are nervous about parent-teacher conferences. You can put your child at ease by ensuring they understand the goal is to help them be successful.

A couple questions to ask your child before the conference could include:

- Is there anything specific you would like me to discuss with your teacher?
- What do you especially like or dislike about your class or school?
- In what areas are you experiencing the most success?
- Are you experiencing challenges in any areas?

Prepare a few notes and questions for the teacher. Prioritize these items in case you run out of time during the conference.

A couple questions to learn more about your child's progress could include:

- What are the key concepts or skills my child is expected to learn this year?
- How will I learn about my child's progress?
- Are there questions you would suggest I ask my child on a daily basis about school?
- What are the best school or district resources that I could use to support academic progress?
- How can I best support you as my child's teacher?

Some suggestions about specific areas of learning:

English Language Arts

- · How is my child's reading ability?
- What are my child's independent reading goals?
- How is my child progressing in terms of meeting standards in reading, writing, speaking and listening?

Math and Science

- How is my child's ability to grasp concepts and perform assigned tasks?
- Can you please show me a sample of my child's work?

Topics you may want to share with your child's teacher could include their gifts and what they enjoy learning about, major changes in your family or your child's home life, or issues at school that your child is worrying about.

During the Conference

Conferences help you and your child's teacher collaborate to support academic success. You have an opportunity to discuss progress and opportunities for support. You and the teacher can share what each of you see as your child's strengths and areas of growth.

You will have the chance to learn about the lessons taught in class as well as how your child is progressing academically, socially and emotionally. If necessary, you and the teacher might create a specific plan to help support academic and/or social success.

Refer to your notes and questions to help prompt topics you want to be sure to cover. Ask the most important questions early in the conference. Remember, you can follow up with the teacher to discuss points or gather information you did not have time to cover.

Ask for clarification. Asking questions helps ensure that you and your child's teacher are on the same page.

Discuss differences of opinion. If you disagree with your child's teacher, engaging in constructive, respectful conversation about these differences can help both of you find an effective way to partner and support your child. It is OK to ask for evidence or more examples if you have a different opinion on a topic.

Write down an action plan that summarizes the steps and strategies discussed during the conferences that will help support your child. Establish the best way to track progress and best methods to stay in touch throughout the year.

Ask how you can support the teacher! There may be ways at home you can help reinforce classroom concepts and expectations. It is important for students to know parents and teachers are partnering to support them.

After the Conference

Share with your child what was discussed during the conference. Start with, and emphasize, the positive points and be direct about areas of needed growth. If you and your child's teacher created an action plan, explain the plan. Make sure to share that together, the teacher and you will be supporting their success!

Follow up on a regular basis. If you have an action plan – set it in motion. Ask your child how they are feeling about school and schoolwork on a regular basis.

Let the teacher know how things are going. Being a role model for positive collaboration with your child's teacher will help stress the importance of education. Clear communication with the teacher will also make sure everyone is tracking progress.

2023-2024 Holy Family School SCRIP Program And Rebate Program

- 1. SCRIP is a noun referring to a form of payment issued by an organization and used to redeem credit. SCRIP simply refers to gift cards purchased from Holy Family School that can be used at various retail stores.
- 2. How it works:
 - ⇒ Holy Family purchases gift cards at various discounted prices determined by the retailer. These cards are then sold at face value.
 - ⇒The difference between the amount the school paid and the amount we sell it for becomes funds raised for the school! The profit will be referred to as your "rebate earned".
 - → For example, if you purchase a restaurant card for \$25, and the rebate from the vendor is 10%, then the SCRIP program just earned \$2.50 towards your "SCRIP profit dollars."
- 3. Every families' SCRIP contract obligation for the **2023-2024** School Year is to earn **\$275** profit dollars. The last day to purchase scrip for this school year is Friday May 3rd, 2024.
- 4. Holy Family sells a wide variety of gift cards: gas, groceries, department stores, retail stores, restaurants, movies, etc.
- 5. SCRIP is available in-person Friday mornings before school, and on Sundays after Masses. Families may also fill out a SCRIP Order Form and send it (with payment) to the school office. Their order will be filled and available for pick up at the school office or will be sent home with your student.
- 6. SCRIP is also available online from the RaiseRight app or <u>RaiseRight website</u>. Please contact Lisa Leskovar for more information.
- 7. Holy Family makes no representations or warranties of any kind with respect to the SCRIP you purchase. We neither endorse nor promote the SCRIP retailers. SCRIP is generally not returnable or refundable; returns/exchanges are permitted on a case by case basis.
- 8. Purchasers of SCRIP agree to indemnify Holy Family against any loss incurred in connection with there being insufficient funds in your account to cover the checks or ACH transfers you issues to pay your SCRIP. Any fees incurred for insufficient funds will be charged to you.
 - → We enforce a two-strike rule. After two instances of insufficient funds from your account, you will no longer be able to participate in the Holy Family School SCRIP Program unless cash is presented at the time an order is placed.
- 9. We are not responsible for lost, damaged, or stolen SCRIP. We do not track individual gift card serial numbers. <u>SCRIP is to be treated like cash.</u>
- 10. This agreement continues until replaced by another or is terminated by either party upon notice to the other.
- 11. When purchasing gift cards online using the RaiseRight App, there will be a \$0.15 charge added during each checkout for ACH transactions or 2.6% for credit card transactions. These fees are collected by RaiseRight and not Holy Family School.

Rebate Program (50/50)

Families who earn ABOVE the required \$275 SCRIP profit dollars can designate funds towards their next year's tuition. Here is how it works:

Once a family has earned their required \$275 profit dollars, the Holy Family School SCRIP program will retain 50% of the family's future rebates received from your SCRIP purchases. The other 50% of the profit dollars rebates may be allocated by you for one of the following choices:

- 1. Tuition credit will be applied towards your or another family's next year's tuition.
- 2. A charitable contribution to Holy Family School.
- 3. A family whose last child is a graduating 8th grader and who is attending a Catholic high school may forward any SCRIP profits to Catholic high school your student has selected to attend. These profits will be sent as scholarship funds in your child's name. For the profits to be sent, a letter of designation to the selected Catholic high school must be sent to Holy Family School by June 1st.
- 4. A family whose last child is a graduating 8th grader and is not attending a Catholic high school, or a family is not returning to Holy Family School, may donate any SCRIP rebates back to Holy Family School or can designate funds to a current Holy Family School family to help with their tuition costs.

NOTE: SCRIP rebates from community members who participate in the SCRIP program but do not have children enrolled at Holy Family School, can be designated to a current school family or to the general SCRIP fund.

With respect to charitable contributions, we will provide you with all required acknowledgements under Sections 170(f)(8) and 170(f)(17) of the Internal Revenue Code.

Funds designated under the guidelines of **a**, **b**, **c**, **or d** apply as long as all other financial obligations are met at the end of the current school year. Otherwise, the funds will go towards the school debt.
