

School Volunteer Agreement

In accordance with Washington State Governor's Proclamation 21-14.2 that requires all volunteers who have an onsite presence with school or child-care activities to be vaccinated against COVID-19 or receive an approved exemption (does not apply to outdoor settings), **all school volunteers are required to complete and return the following agreement.**

This agreement applies to any person volunteering for school-related programs and activities who work with or around children including extra-curricular activities (i.e., CYO, after school clubs/events).

Part I.

Please attest to your vaccination status by checking one of the lines below:

- _____ I am fully vaccinated* and can provide documentation if requested by school administration.
**The CDC defines an individual as fully vaccinated when they have received both doses in a two-dose COVID-19 vaccine primary series or one dose of a single-dose COVID-19 primary series approved or authorized for use in the United States. Note: Staying up to date with all recommended vaccinations and boosters is the best option to protect from severe disease and hospitalization.*
- _____ I am unvaccinated and will only be participating in outdoor activities, therefore do not need to request an exemption from the school.
- _____ I am unvaccinated and I am requesting a medical or moral/ethical exemption (check the appropriate box below) so that I may participate in all school related activities. I understand that the CDC and the Archdiocese of Seattle recommend vaccination for the prevention and mitigation of COVID-19.
- ☐ I attest that I have a medical condition that prevents me from safely receiving the COVID-19 vaccine.
- ☐ I attest that I have a sincerely held moral/ethical objection to the COVID-19 vaccine.

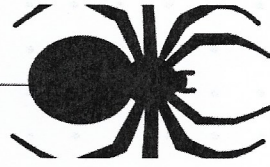

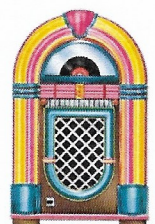

What is a donation vs procurement? A donation is a good or service you purchase or create to donate to the auction. Procurement is you going to a business and requesting them to donate to our auction. While procurement can take a bit more time & effort, it is a way to save you money. Remember that rare & not easily accessible items such as vacation homes, travel experiences and sporting event suites inspire generous bidding. Be creative!! Please note antiques must have paperwork documenting they are indeed antiques. All other items should be new. Below are some donation ideas.

- **Do you have a close relationship with a business owner?** Consider asking them to donate their services or their products. Restaurant owners, yoga teachers, hair stylists, manicurists, landscape designers, home decorators, gourmet chefs, fitness instructors, coaches, dentists, dermatologists, lawyers, etc. can donate their services!
- **Do you love to cook?** Donate a custom-made dish, your grandmother's favorite cake, a full dinner party, a brunch or a wine tasting for 6 people that you prepare at home.
- **"Deliveries to Your Doorstep"** is always a popular category. Why not deliver that homemade meal, the Sunday newspaper, or bring croissants or cupcakes to someone's house?
- **Can you get sports and show tickets?** Donate season tickets to any of the local pro or college sports teams or to any local music or theater company's performances.
- **Can you offer your time and skills?** Consider donating a few hours of computer tech support, handy man/woman work, yard work, house cleaning, painting, tutoring, a Christmas light service or even hauling (if you own a truck).
- **Do you, your family, or a friend have a family beach house/vacation home/time-share?** Consider donating a mutually agreeable week/weekend there. You can set the date range.
- **Gather a Basket of Goods:** You can put together a themed basket like a gourmet chef's, gardening, baby shower/bridal shower, dog/cat lover's, cheese/wine or offer a single vintage bottle of wine or Champagne?
- **Do you belong to a Club?** Why not invite a few bidders for a round of golf or an introduction to your favorite social club?
- **Consider offering gift certificates to your favorite places:** restaurant, wine or cheese shop, cigar store, bookstore, or for a massage, pedicure & manicure at your favorite salon!
